### Past simple

How to use the simple past

The simple past tense is used to describe an action that happened in the past.

The past simple of regular verbs is typically formed by adding "-ed" to the end of the verb (e.g., "talk" = "talked").

Irregular verbs don't follow a specific pattern: some take the same form as the infinitive (e.g., "put"), while others change completely (e.g., "go" = "went").

Negative: -

did + not = didn't

In the negative sentences, we normally use the short word "didn't"

Subject + didn't + v(base)
```

Question: -

Did + subject + v (base)..?

Example: - Did she live in Baghdad?

yes, she did / No, she didn't



#### 1

The Republic of Singapore is an island in South-East Asia, just 137km north of the Equator. It became an independent city-state in 1965. Singapore has few natural resources. However, it developed a strong economy and is a popular tourist destination. People come here for its fabulous shopping, the famous Singapore Zoo, and its beautiful man-made beaches. Singapore has a rich mixture of people and many languages are spoken here, including Malay, English, Mandarin, and Tamil.
